



Dear Springboard supporters and friends,

Please find attached the final report of Springboard's relief operation after typhoon Ondoy hit Manila last year. It includes all given donations and a list of donors. To preserve their privacy we have only listed the initials of individual donors. To find your donation just look for the date and your initials. In total **8,862,958.60** million Pesos worth of cash and in-kind donations were received. 6,137,209.77 million worth of goods have been donated and the remaining balance of 2,725,748.83 million is earmarked for sustainable projects like housing, skills-training and small business start-up capital to help families back on their feet.

We would like to express our deep gratitude again to our donors. We were touched by many groups who have raised funds in unison, especially children's groups like the German European School Singapore and Kindergarten as well as the entire community of the village Wurmlingen in Germany including the Kindergarten Don Bosco, Brauereigaststatte Hirschen, Wumlingen, Rotary Club, Tuttlingen. Even the local pub raised money for the Filipino people.

Thanks to YOU all Springboard was able to bring great relief to thousands of people.

Montalban



On September the 26th, 2009, typhoon Ondoy (Ketsana) hit the Philippines and caused mass destruction, changing the lives of hundreds of thousands of people. One area which was badly affected was Montalban. Due to the flood left in the aftermath of the typhoon the streets, walkways and houses became filled with knee high stinking mud that stayed there for weeks and ruined people's homes. Around 60,000 people were in need of help when they faced severe problems such as infections, diseases, dengue, flue, hunger, thirst, a lack of basic goods and shelter. Springboard Foundation extended help in many ways, from clearing the path of mud to medical missions and food distributions.

We worked together with Sarah McLeod of the British Women's Association, Craig Burrows of the Papaya Academy and Barangay Captain Roger Frias to deliver goods to those people who were living in areas that were covered in foul mud. We delivered these goods house to house and from an emergency relief station to long lines of people, often more than a thousand came in search for something to feed their children with. Volunteers delivered relief packages to the residents of nearby Payatas, which is known as smoky mountain (the ever smouldering garbage hills). Complete sets of equipment for 5 soup kitchens were delivered and sacks of charcoal together with charcoal ovens were distributed which gave quick access to cooking facilities to a few hundred people. 200 cooked meals were delivered along with donations of clothes, blankets, buckets, toilet paper, soap and other helpful goods.

Three water purification stations were installed to provide long-term improvement and access to safe drinking water. Many medical missions were organized which served up to two thousand people in a day. Montalban had the highest occurrence of Leptospirosis during that time but the lowest mortality rate. We believe this is thanks to the tireless work of our medical volunteers, organized by Caroline Cliff. We were fortunate to have the support of many organizations that donated relief goods and sent many volunteers such as the International School Manila, British School, the British Women's Association, the Angel Brigade, Tulong Bayan, the Philippine Red Cross, Craig Burrows and the Asian Students

Christian Foundation & Chairman Frias of Montalban. Monark donated a loader for 3 weeks to help clear the roads.

Allison Doig Henderson and Linda Dallison came to the rescue to organize a packing station right in Makati where they received the donations and packed them in individual bags. Lane Moving and DHL sent many trucks to transport all the goods from Makati to the affected areas.

BIÑAN, LAGUNA



In Binan, Laguna over 114,700 people were made homeless and many lived on the top floors of their houses for up to 4 months, waiting for the flood to subside. Springboard Foundation worked with long time-partner Hope Worldwide Foundation, Brent International School, We International Foundation, the Municipal Office of Binan, Caroline Cliff and her medical team, the Alabang Ladies International Group, U.S. Embassy Club, Save the Children, Biotech, ABS-CBN Foundation and Ronna Lao.

When we looked down the flooded streets it looked almost idyllic, but it was far from that. The toilets didn't flush because the water level was too high. The water was dangerously filled with garbage and sewage. Everyday people had to make their way through it to reach dry ground, to get to work school or do their shopping. Children were swimming in water that looked thick and black. Plastic bags with refuse and worse are floating along side the swimming children. This was a place ready for diseases to strike. And no end was in site for many months. People needed food, water and clothing. Springboard received generous donations of water purification tablets. The tablets were dissolved in water and then the water was distributed to families who lacked drinking water. Prices for potable water had shot through the roof and many had lost their jobs because they couldn't come to work since they didn't want to leave their families alone in the flood. So food and water supply had become scarce for them. Some houses had electricity which was worrying because the outlet and lines were submerged in the waters.

Relief goods were coming in from various agencies and were being distributed in different locations but there was no coordination between the organizations and no information given to the local Municipal office. It was impossible to track who received what and who was left without receiving anything. Some families had stocks of relief goods while others had nothing. Springboard then organized weekly coordination meetings in the Mayor's office to which all organizations were invited so that a common strategy could be found and distribution was fair. It also gave the Mayor's team a chance to inform the organizations about the current needs status and kept everyone motivated. November 6th was one of the days that showed what we could achieve by coordinating all efforts. Biotech Philippines, led by Mr. Chito San Augustin, disinfected seven of Binan's nine still active evacuation centres; a garbage collection round took place where volunteers from WE International, the Hope International and Springboard helped Binan's Environmental Office with their garbage

collection rounds in the still-flooded areas in Malaban. Following the morning activities was a distribution drive of relief goods including food, hygiene products, water, clothing and fresh fruits for the 2,000 families.

4 medical missions were arranged by Springboard's medical advisor Caroline Cliff and benefited 1500 people.

In the last week of November everyone joined forces to prepare starter kits for 511 families in Lankiwa, who had been relocated there because the area where they had previously lived had been declared un-safe by the government.

BAGUIO



Many areas were affected by typhoon Ondoy and Pepeng, which hit the Northern Luzon area of the country within a space of two weeks. Especially Baguio, Calasiao, Mangaldan, Tuguegarao, and Urdaneta were badly affected. Many people were stranded on their roofs, while their homes were flooded.

In La Trinidad, Benguet, the devastation was even worse, the death toll was rising daily as rescuers continued to wade through the hardening mud that buried a community on a hillside called "Little Kibungan". A loud sound of sort preceded the large mudslide in "Little Kibungan". Just near the town's boundary with the City of Pines, a bridge had come down along with almost thirty vehicles. An assortment of cars now lay washing themselves in the waters of Balili River.

WE International organized a rescue plane to fly supplies into the area which until then was unreachable by land transport. Brent International School and Springboard Foundation joined the effort by contributing many relief items for the operation. Once they reached the area the volunteers had to hike up the mountain to reach the victims of the disaster. The water purification tablets were particularly helpful here because it would have been impossible to carry potable water up the mountains.
