

## Summer Get Away

To celebrate their Night High scholars' recent successes and to further strengthen the bonds they have formed in the past 5 years, Robert Bosch, Inc. sponsored a team-building activity for the 74 Night High scholars of the Bosch Class of 2010 from Siena College, Taytay, Rizal and Siena College, Quezon City.

The team-building activity, held at the Bird's i-View Resort in Taytay, Rizal was a day-long event organized by ABC Foundation for the Night High scholars of the Bosch Class of 2010 to interact and to get to know each other better.





Fifty-six of the seventy-six members of the Bosch Class of 2010 attended the team-building event last April 29. The 56 scholars were divided into six groups with eight to nine members of scholars from both campuses, to participate in the various games designed to have them interact and work together to accomplish a shared goal. The games of the team-building activity included; "Q and A," a game where the groups must correctly answer multiple choice questions about ABC Foundation, Springboard Foundation and Robert Bosch Inc.; "Sing-It," where participants needed to sing random songs on a videoke machine and record their scores; "Step My

Mine," where a blind-folded member of a group must collect different laminated logos scattered on the ground.





Each logo (ABC Foundation, Springboard Foundation, Robert Bosch, Inc.) has an assigned point value still is unknown to the group members; "Carry Me Baby," wherein members of a group must carry one of their members from one end of the pool to the other without getting him/her wet; "Lokong-Logo" where the participants needed to put together the pieces of a puzzle to form a certain company logo; and "Hipunin mo Hija" where all the members of a group must swim and collect the different laminated logos of ABC Foundation, Springboard Foundation and Bosch Inc at the bottom of the pool. Each logo has corresponding points unknown to the members. The different groups collect and record their points as they accomplish the different activities. The group which completes the course with the most number of points wins the teambuilding challenge.

After the short program, the scholars and guests were free to enjoy the day swimming, singing videoke, playing water basketball, eating, or just enjoying the camaraderie.
